We had a great clinic this year! There were 20 participants in kayaking clinics ranging in level from beginner to advanced intermediate. The raft and canoe clinics had 7 people each, for a grand total of 34 participants in this year's clinic. Twenty one awesome people volunteered their time and expertise to make this happen - fourteen instructors and seven assistants and safety boaters! THANK YOU!

River Trip Reports: Present

This trip report provided by Scott Carpenter, he and his crew recently paddle in Colorado on the Arkansas River over the July 4th holiday.

We ended up with 13 people camped on private land with 9 rafts and occasional kayaks and paddle boats that joined us.

Five trucks with trailers and even dedicated shuttle drivers for a couple days/runs.

Flows where 1150 for Browns and Numbers and 1500 for the Royal Gorge (down from 4500 peak two weeks prior).

Technical runs with clear water and lots of smooth granite boulders and tight lines.

High commercial activity so start early and be polite and quick at ramps.

Roughly 800 highway/shuttle miles for 53 miles of class III+ through V- over four days.

Editor's note: AWC Board member Chuck Zemach of Los Alamos had a permit to run the Colorado River in Grand Canyon late in June this summer (1983). The Colorado's flow reached a post-Glen Canyon dam high of 92,500 cubic feet per second (cfs) while Chuck's party was on the River. ADOBE MUD is pleased to present the first in a series of two articles describing this once - in - a - lifetime experience.
